The citywide sanitary sewer rehabilitation project is almost half way completed. The process starts with the contractor hanging door tags at each home, to notify residents that work is anticipated to take place on that street in the near future. These notices contain instructions, dates and times that the work is to be completed. There also has been many street or traffic reductions involved in this project but we have done our best to keep lanes open throughout this process. Only in a few areas did we need to detour traffic or close the street during the relining work. Keep in mind this project was a greatly needed upgrade to our sewer system; this will improve and prolong the sanitary system for many years to come.

Our Volunteer Fire Department has experienced a record number of calls this year. The Volunteer Fire Department members have done a great job answering the call of duty. #### **NEW YEARS EVE FIREWORKS**

January 1st from 12:00 a.m. - 12:30 a.m.

#### Penalty:

Any discharging of consumer fireworks outside of the excepted dates, hours, or locations, or under conditions restricted shall be deemed a simple misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$250.00.

#### Restrictions:

- Class 1 and Class 2 may NOT be discharged by anyone under the age of 18
- Novelties may be discharged by anyone 5 or older but only when supervised by an adult.
- Individuals may only light fireworks on their own property or property where they have the consent of the owner.
- No fireworks are permitted to be charged on areas zoned C-3/Commercial or C4/Commercial.
- No individual shall discharge fireworks within 30 feet of another person or within 30 feet of a structure.
- No person shall discharge consumer fireworks at any time when Pottawattamie County has issued a burn ban.
- Fireworks are not permitted on public property which includes the right-of-way (i.e. street, sidewalks, parks)

We hope this will help minimize the problems neighborhoods have been having with out of town traffic looking for these parks.

The first year of the Carter Lake cheer, flag and tackle football season is complete. We had a combined total of nearly 150 kids participate. The kids all grew in

skill set, confidence and character. They have proven all season to be successful on and off the field. Our goal this season was to create a "family feel" environment that parents feel confident in and have support and help with their kiddos as well as offer programs that kids are excited and proud to be a part of. The program motto quickly became "Who's got my back? I GOT YOUR BACK!" The coaches, kids and families soaked up the meaning of this and proved the motto true time and time again over the season.

Our cheerleaders had a successful first season. They ranged from ages 4-13. Over the season the cheerleaders focused on how to work as a team to get









the crowd engaged and excited during games which in turn turned to added support for the football players. The cheer teams worked hard on building their confidence in cheers, tumbling, and harder, more challenging stunts. The girls realized that stunting can be both scary and exciting, especially when trying new skills. Coach Melissa said the girls did great and she was proud of their improvement and commitment all season.

Our flag teams were so exciting to watch in growth

this season. Our teams consisted of kids ages preschool-4th grade. Coach Jager of the preschool & kindergarteners said he was extremely proud of the growth over the season from his kids. He said the kids went from running the wrong direction at the beginning of the season to winning games at the end of the season. Coach Tommy of the 1st & 2nd graders said he was proud of the kids on his team. They came out eager and excited to learn every week and it showed on the field. Coach Jarred Christo of another









1st & 2nd grade team said he was extremely proud of the progress his team made over the season. He is already eager to get these kids back and on the field. Coach Jake Larsen of our last 1st & 2nd grade team said he loved his season with his kids. He said he had high expectations of his kids coming to work every practice and game and it showed. He said they finished the season as one of the best in their league. Our 3rd & 4th grade coaches were all smiles when talking about their kids. The coaches said each kid improved in at least one area over the season.

Our tackle teams have been hard at work since July 26th. The kids were broken up into 3 teams: 3rd/4th, 5th/6th and 7th/8th. The kids quickly learned the transition from flag to tackle and adjusted well. All of the program coaches worked together the first few weeks and really began to implement our program's foundation. The coaches told the kids tackle football is where mental and physical toughness is developed. The kids all improved and developed this over the course of the season. Each kid also improved in more than one area- whether it was being able to









complete conditioning, learning and growing in basic fundamentals, gaining confidence, learning to be a team player and/or improving in skills. All teams had a successful first season.

<u>3rd/4th grade:</u> Division Champions and held a record of 8-1. Placing 4th out of 23 teams.

<u>5th/6th grade</u>: Division Champions and advanced through playoffs making it to the Championship Bowl. Although they fell short with their first loss of the season, the Carter Lake Jackets finished 2nd place out of 33 teams with an overall 10-1 record.

All three tackle football teams competed in the Iowa Westside Classic Tournament in Des Moines over the Halloween weekend. The weekend was full of comradery and growth. The 3/4 grade and 7/8 grade teams finished the weekend in 5th place. The 5/6 grade team not only won the tournament championship, they were the only recreational team invited to the All-Stars National Tournament. The team will travel to Kansas City, KS December 3rd-5th to compete for a National Title.

With it being the first year of this program, we took detailed notes of things that worked and things

that can be improved upon. We are excited to keep these programs growing in a positive direction and help get more of our youth involved. We want to give a big thanks to all of our volunteer coaches and their families for giving up so much of your time and investing so much heart and guidance into our youth. Also a heart-felt thank you to the parents- Thank you for always driving your kids to practices, games, washing (and rewashing) dirt stained uniforms, the late night dinners and all the support you have given to our program this season.
