ANNOUNCEMENTS AND REMINDERS

NEW YEARS EVE FIREWORKS

January 1st from 12:00 a.m. - 12:30 a.m.

Penalty:

Any discharging of consumer fireworks outside of the excepted dates, hours, or locations, or under conditions restricted shall be deemed a simple misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$250.00.

Restrictions:

- Class 1 and Class 2 may NOT be discharged by anyone under the age of 18
- Novelties may be discharged by anyone 5 or older but only when supervised by an adult.
- Individuals may only light fireworks on their own property or property where they have the consent of the owner.
- No fireworks are permitted to be charged on areas zoned C-3/Commercial or C4/Commercial.
- No individual shall discharge fireworks within 30 feet of another person or within 30 feet of a structure.
- No person shall discharge consumer fireworks at any time when Pottawattamie County has issued a burn ban.
- Fireworks are not permitted on public property which includes the right-of-way (i.e. street, sidewalks, parks)

SNOW REMOVAL

Sadly to say, winter is coming soon.

Please remember that all sidewalks must be cleared of snow and ice within 24-hours after the snow stops. If you do not remove your snow and ice, the City may remove it and charge you per foot for removal plus a \$75 administrative fee. Please keep your sidewalks

clear of snow and ice.

The Carter Lake Community Presbyterian Food and Pet Food Pantry will be distributing United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farmers to Families Food Boxes on Saturday, December 12, 2020 from 12:00 PM to 4:00 PM at their pantry location at 3030 N. 9th Street, Carter Lake, Iowa.
