### Garbage and Recycling in Carter Lake

<u>Trash/Yard Waste:</u> The center of 13th Street is the dividing line, meaning half of the street is picked up on each day. All residents west of 13th St. are picked up on

Wednesdays. All residents east of 13th St., trash and yard waste is collected on Thursdays. Waste Connections no longer rents the 96 gallon carts, but you may provide your own. **Recycling** All residents will have their recycling picked up on Mondays of each week.

Waste Connections offers small commercial dumpsters for businesses and large roll off dumpsters for businesses or home needs for a fee.

<u>Helpful Tips</u> to ensure your trash or recycling is picked up every week

- Place trash or recycling on the curb in front of your house no later than 5 a.m. the day your trash or recycling is scheduled for pickup.
- Trash cans must be on the curb. Employees will not go into the yard or garage to fetch containers.
- Trash must be inside trash receptacles not in bags on ground
- Limit of 5 containers per week

# Clearing snow away from fire hydrants

When winter is at its coldest, you may want to spend most of your time inside. However, it's important to keep and eye on what's happening outdoors too. Wintry weather can create fire safety hazards such as ice or heavy



snowfall that can obstruct fire hydrants. You can help reduce the risk by keeping fire hydrants accessible and clear of ice and snow.

#### Why It Matters

In an emergency, every second counts. Fire hydrants that are blocked, concealed, or difficult to access due to snow or ice and impede emergency fire response.

Fire trucks carry a limited amount of water, so one of the first tasks upon arriving at a fire is to locate a water supply from the nearest hydrant. Hydrants covered in snow can be difficult to locate, and uncovering them can waste valuable time needed during the fire fight. Keeping them clear can mean easier access to water and more time doing what really matters - fighting the fire.

## **ANNOUNCEMENTS AND REMINDERS**

#### PET REGISTRATIONS

- Starting January 1st at City Hall
- \$15 for intact cats and dogs
- \$10 for spayed/neutered cats and dogs
- If registered after March 1st there is an additional \$5 late fee added per pet
- Must provide proof of vaccinations
- Registration and use of tags allows Animal Control to successfully return pets to owners.

#### **SNOW REMOVAL**

Please remember that all sidewalks must be cleared of snow and ice within 24-hours after the snow stops.

If you do not remove your snow and ice, the city may remove it and charge per foot for the removal plus a \$25 administrative fee. Please keep your sidewalks clear of snow and ice.

#### **SNOW EMERGENCY**

If a snow emergency is declared by the mayor, the dates and times of the emergency will be broadcast on local radio and television stations.

If there is more than 4" of snow and the mayor declares a snow emergency, there shall be

no parking on the streets, avenues, or alleys until the street is cleared.

You will be allowed to park on your yard until the street is cleared in front of your residence.

#### PROPER DISPOSAL OF LARGE ITEMS

Do you have a couch, chairs, or appliances that need to go to the landfill? It is the owner's responsibility to contact Waste Connections and pre-pay the fee for pickup. Only after the fee is paid will the items be picked up on your next garbage collection day. These items should <u>not</u> be left on the curb until pickup has been scheduled. City Code 177.02 OWNER REQUIREMENTS. Every owner shall comply with the following numbering requirements:

#### **HOUSE NUMBERS REQUIRED**

The owner shall place or cause to be installed and maintained on the principal building the assigned number in a conspicuous place facing the street in figures not less than **four (4) inches in height** and of a contrasting color with their background.

Failure to Comply. If an owner refuses to number a building as herein provided, or fails to
