Once the permit application has been approved, a member of the staff will contact you to pick up and collect payment at the office.

Examples of work that requires a permit: Replacement or new windows, roofing, deck, fence, pools, driveway, and sidewalk; Replacement of water heaters, furnace, and air conditioning, plumbing and electrical, also require a permit.

WEEDS & MOWING

It is that time of year again when the grass and weeds take over our lawns. It is the responsibility of all property owners to keep their land and the adjacent parking areas free of weeds and grass that are 9" or taller. The City will have any uncontrolled weed growth abated without prior notice to the property owner. The cost of the abatement will be billed to the property owner along with a \$75 administrative fee. Do not mow, or sweep grass clipping onto the street or curb!

ANIMAL CONTROL

Here are a few things you need to know to keep your pets safe:

- 1. Anytime you have animals outside unattended, you need to provide a few things for them. Clean water and an approved shelter must be provided at all times. This is a requirement of the city ordinances, regardless of how long the animal is outside.
- 2. Your animal can only be outside for 30 minutes if it is on a leash or chain. The only exception to this

is if an adult over the age of 19 is outside with the animal or you have a fully fenced yard. Additionally, if you do have an animal on a tie-out, you must make certain that it cannot reach public sidewalks or your neighbor's yard.

- 3. Remember to pick up your pet waste. Not only is this a health hazard to your animal but it can also be a nuisance to your neighbors. The warmer weather will cause excess pet waste to smell very badly. The first offense could result in a \$500.00 fine.
- 4. Barking dogs are a common complaint. It is your responsibility as a dog owner to control your dog's actions, especially barking. Barking dogs can be heard for blocks and usually set off a chain reaction of other dogs barking.
- 5. It is unlawful to leave an animal unattended in a vehicle. Temperatures inside vehicles can easily reach over 100 degrees. This can cause serious health problems and even result in death. Even with the windows cracked and a bowl of water, the temperatures can still be too much for your animal to handle.





CARTER LAKE GOLF CARTS REGULATIONS (REVISED JANUARY 2022)

77.01 PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to permit the operation of golf carts on streets in the City as authorized by Section 321.247 of the Code of Iowa. This chapter applies whenever a golf cart is operated on any street or alley.

77.02 DEFINITIONS. "Golf cart" means a three or four wheeled recreational vehicle generally used for transportation of person(s) in the sport of **golf** that is either electric powered or gas powered with an engine displacement of less than 300 cubic centimeters, and a total dry weight of less than 800 pounds.

77.03 OPERATION OF GOLF CARTS PERMITTED. Golf carts may be operated upon the streets of the City by persons possessing a valid driver's license, except as prohibited in Section 77.05 of this chapter.

77.04 PROHIBITED STREETS, SIDEWALKS, PARKING, AND PARKS. Golf carts shall not be operated off road in any playground, park or publicly owned property; shall not be operated upon any City street which is a primary road extension through the City. However, golf carts may cross such a primary road extension. Golf carts shall not be allowed on 9th Street, 13th Street, Locust Street, or any portion of Abbott Drive. Golf carts shall not be operated upon the public sidewalk, trail, or that portion of the street located between the curb line and the sidewalk or property line commonly referred to as the "parking." Golf carts shall not be operated in or on any park, playground, trail, or upon any publicly owned property. Golf carts may park in designated public parking areas.

77.05 UNLAWFUL OPERATION.

- 1. No golf carts shall be operated or parked upon City sidewalks or trails.
- 2. All state motor vehicle laws apply.
- 3. No person shall operate a golf cart in a careless, reckless, or negligent manner endangering the person or property of another or causing injury or damage to same.
 - 4. No golf cart shall carry more passengers than golf cart was designed for by manufacturer.

77.06 EQUIPMENT. Golf carts operated upon City streets shall be equipped with a minimum of the following safety features:

- 1. A regulation (16") slow moving vehicle sign displayed on the rear of the vehicle.
- 2. A regulation visible bicycle safety flag (a flag with an area of not less than six (6) by nine (9) inches of fluorescent orange color on a staff holder to put such flag at least five (5) feet above the surface of the street) at all times during operation.
 - 3. Shall be equipped with adequate brakes.
 - 4. Rear view mirror driver's side.

77.07 HOURS OF OPERATION. Golf carts may be operated on City streets only between sunrise and sunset.

77.08 SPEED. No golf cart shall be operated on any City street at a speed in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour. Posted speed limits must be followed in accordance with the Code of Iowa.

77.09 PARKING PROHIBITED. Removed.

77.10 PERMITS. No person shall operate a golf cart on any public street or alley, for any purpose, unless the owner possesses a City of Carter Lake permit to operate a golf cart on City streets, issued by the Police Department.

- 1. Golf cart owners may apply for a permit from the Carter Lake Police Department on forms provided by the City.
- 2. The Police Department shall not issue a permit until the owner has provided the following:
 - a. Evidence that the owner/operator is at least 16 years of age and possesses a valid lowa driver's license.
 - b. Proof that owner and operator have liability insurance covering operation of golf carts on City streets in the amount required by lowa Code.
- 3. All permits shall be issued for a specific golf cart. Permit holders will be issued a number and sticker to affix to the left side rear fender or similar component and said sticker must be visible at all times.
- 4. The fee for such permits shall be <u>Twenty dollars (\$20.00)</u>. Permits will be granted for <u>three (3) years</u> valid from May 1 through April 30 each year. Permits may be purchased at any time during the year but will be valid only through April 30.
- 5. The permit may be suspended or revoked upon finding evidence that the permit holder has violated the conditions of the permit or has abused the privilege of being a permit holder. There will be no refund of the permit fee.
- 6. If an under-age unlicensed person is operating a golf cart, the Police Department shall issue one warning citation to the parent or guardian of the under-age unlicensed person. The warning shall be signed by the parent or guardian and returned to the Police Department within seven (7) days of issuance. Upon the second occurrence, the operator and/or parent or guardian will be cited under Section 77.05 with penalties set forth in Section 77.11 and shall be required to appear in court. The permit for the golf cart shall be automatically revoked.
- **77.11 PENALTY.** In addition to the suspension or revocation of the permit, any person who violates this chapter shall be fined \$300.00.



RESIDENTS MUST HAVE ALL ITEMS OUT ON THE CURB BEFORE 6 AM SATURDAY MORNING

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Trees, shrubbery, carpet, fencing, poles, iron, etc. must be cut in 4' lengths, bundled, and cannot weigh more than 50 pounds per bundle; Yard and Garden waste;
- White Goods (Appliances) MUST be empty with doors removed; water heater, stove dehumidifier, freezer, air conditioner, TV.
- Furniture, household items, trash
- Empty paint cans will <u>ONLY</u> be accepted if the drivers can see that the paint is dried or absorbed with a substance like cat litter or saw dust.

NO MORE TIRES

Due to rising costs, Carter Lake will no longer collect tires for disposal.



MATERIALS THAT WILL NOT BE PICKED UP

- Construction Demolition materials (bricks, stones, concrete, concrete block or rubble, shingles, lumber, landscape timbers, siding, and drywall).
- Liquids (motor oil, antifreeze, paint, and household chemicals). Some service stations accept motor oil for recycling.
- Hazardous materials (flammables, propane tanks, auto parts, explosives). Auto parts should be taken to an auto salvage yard. Propane Tanks and Hazardous Materials may be dropped off to the Recycling Center, 4441 Gifford Road, Council Bluffs (712) 328-4985
