# **Carter Lake Newsletter**

Hello again,

We are making big strides on key projects in our City. For example, the city wide sewer relining and manhole rehabilitation job is out for bid. We should be very close to hiring a contractor to complete this much needed upgrade. The community center project is in the final planning stages and we should start construction this Fall. It will be a 12 month building project, therefore, a Fall of 2022 opening date is planned. The city wide water system assessment is underway. We have a contractor in town who are going to every water valve and fire hydrant checking them and exercising turning them on and off. They will locate and define what is working properly and what isn't working properly. After this assessment, we will have a plan to start replacing and upgrading the old water distribution system valves, thus enabling the city to isolate streets when a problem occurs. This has been very challenging in the past with old water valves which didn't function properly. The street improvements have started. We have milled and repayed 3 streets already this Spring. The next step is to start cutting out some bad area's in the concrete streets and replacing panels. Our focus is to try and minimize any delays.

# ANNOUNCEMENTS AND REMINDERS

#### **WEEDS & MOWING**

It is that time of year again when the grass and weeds take over our lawns. It is the responsibility of all property owners to keep their land and the adjacent parking areas free of weeds and grass that are 9" or taller. The City will have any uncontrolled weed growth abated without prior notice to the property owner. The cost of the abatement will be billed to the property owner along with a \$75 administrative fee. Do not mow, or sweep grass clipping onto the street or curb!

#### ANIMAL CONTROL

Here are a few things you need to know to keep your pets safe

- 1. Anytime you have animals outside unattended, you need to provide a few things for them. Clean water and an approved shelter must be provided at all times. This is a requirement of the city ordinances, regardless of how long the animal is outside.
- 2. Your animal can only be outside for 30 minutes if it is on a leash or chain. The only exception to this is if an adult over the age of 19 is outside with the animal or you have a fully fenced yard. Additionally, if you do have an animal on a tie-out, you must make certain that it cannot reach public sidewalks or your neighbor's yard.
- 3. Remember to pick up your pet waste. Not only is this a health hazard to your animal but it can also be a nuisance to your neighbors. The warmer weather will cause excess pet waste to smell very badly. The first offense could result in a \$500.00 fine.
- 4. Barking dogs are a common complaint. It is your responsibility as a dog owner to control your dog's actions, especially barking. Barking dogs can be heard for blocks and usually set off a chain reaction of other dogs barking.
- 5. It is unlawful to leave an animal unattended in a vehicle. Temperatures inside vehicles can easily reach over 100 degrees. This can cause serious health problems and even result in death. Even with the windows cracked and a bowl of water, the temperatures can still be too much for your animal to handle.

## **BOATING ON CARTER LAKE**

"Slow, No Wake Speed"—This is a speed at which the vessel does not produce a wake. "Wake" means any movement of water created by a vessel that adversely affects the activities of another person or that may adversely affect the shoreline or seawalls in the canals.

Any vessel operating in a speed zone posted as "Idle Speed - No Wake" must operate at the minimum speed that allows you to maintain steering and make headway. (This means no wake whatsoever - possibly 600-900 RPMs, depending on your boat). This rule normally restricts these vessels to 4 statute miles per hour or less

"No Wake" is done to prevent waves from splashing against and eroding the bank. A wake is the region of recirculating flow immediately behind a moving or stationary solid body, caused by the flow of surrounding fluid around the body.

These zones are also declared in some places to protect aquatic life and in other places it is to prevent docked boats from rocking too much or causing damage to expensive sea walls.

#### REQUIRED PERMITS

Building permits are available online and at City Hall. Here is a list of a few permits that are required: decks, sidewalks, siding, windows & door replacement, roofing, interior and exterior structural renovations, garage, shed, fences, replacement of a water heater, furnace or air conditioner, all plumbing and electrical upgrades.

#### SIDEWALK REPAIRS

Remember it is property owners responsibility to replace damaged or unsafe sections of sidewalk that are located on your property. Please be aware that the Building Inspector will be out inspecting and marking sidewalks that are in need of repairs or replacement.

# ATTENTION RESIDENTS Work is scheduled to take place May 10 - 20

The City of Carter Lake has hired RJN Group to conduct a study of the water distribution system. Over the next few weeks, crews will be exercising valves and flushing fire hydrants in the Carter Lake water distribution system. During these tests, you may see the quick release of water from fire hydrants. The testing improves water quality and ensures that adequate water flow is available to fire fighters, residents, and businesses.

This is not a "Boil Water Notice."

### If Your Water is Discolored

Water may temporarily appear discolored and may appear to have a brown or reddish tint because mineral deposits that settle in the water lines are stirred up during the testing. The discoloration of water will subside after testing is complete.

The discolored water is safe and non-hazardous. However, discolored water may cause staining to laundry. If the water in your home is discolored, you should:

- Avoid using washing machine until water flow is clear
- Open both hot and cold water faucets until water flow is clear
- Check faucet screens for trapped particles

## Crews on Your Property

Hydrant testing involves opening and flushing of hydrants in streets and easements. Valve exercising involves accessing valves and operating them.

Some water lines, hydrants, and valves may be in a public easement near your property. Whenever these hydrants require investigation, crews will need access to the easements. Please temporarily secure your pets away from these locations. Workers will not need to enter your house, and you do not need to be home.

#### Benefits to You

The information gained from these tests will be used to improve your water service. Hydrant testing improves water quality by removing sediments within the water lines and helps identify deficient hydrants for future repair. Your cooperation is appreciated.

# RESIDENTS MUST HAVE ALL ITEMS OUT ON THE CURB BEFORE 6 AM SATURDAY MORNING

## **ACCEPTABLE ITEMS**

- Trees, shrubbery, carpet, fencing, poles, iron, etc. must be cut in 4' lengths, bundled, and cannot weigh more than 50 pounds per bundle; Yard and Garden waste;
- White Goods (Appliances) MUST be empty with doors removed; water heater, stove dehumidifier, freezer, air conditioner, TV.
- Furniture, household items, trash
- Empty paint cans will <u>ONLY</u> be accepted if the drivers can see that the paint is dried or absorbed with a substance like cat litter or saw dust.
- ALL TIRES Put tires inside dumpster at the Maintenance Shop on Saturday ONLY!



# MATERIALS THAT WILL NOT BE PICKED UP

- Construction Demolition materials
   (bricks, stones, concrete, concrete block or rubble, shingles, lumber, landscape timbers, siding, and drywall).
- Liquids (motor oil, antifreeze, paint, and household chemicals). Some service stations accept motor oil for recycling.
- Hazardous materials (flammables, propane tanks, auto parts, explosives). Auto parts should be taken to an auto salvage yard. Propane Tanks and Hazardous Materials may be dropped off to the Recycling Center, 4441 Gifford Road, Council Bluffs (712) 328-4985
