Hello again,

On October 1st, Carter Lake had the honor to host Vice President Pence. This was something our town has never experienced before. The city had a day to get prepared for the visit of Vice President Pence. All the city employees and property owners came together to prepare our city for this momentous visit. Once we found out the route the motorcade would take, the Parks Department put up the flags and spruced up Locust street. The Maintenance Department cleaned the street and assisted with blocking roads, and Fire and Rescue was on site with a squad and support staff during the Vice President's visit. The Police Department was on site and involved with securing the motorcade route. City hall organized a lunch for the other law enforcement involved in the joint endeavor of securing the route the motorcade would travel. A Secret Service Agent told our Police Captain that the town looked great and it was a nice touch to have the flags out and the marquee welcoming Vice President Pence to Carter Lake. It was exhilarating to see everyone come together to make our town look GREAT!

The Parks and Maintenance crews are nearly done with the sea wall project at Mabrey Park. Over the years, the wave action has been pulling the rock out from under the large block wall letting the blocks fall into the water. We lifted out the blocks installed and leveled rock. Then reinstalled the block along the east water way. They also installed rip rap to armor the shoreline. This project was done inhouse with our staff, from the recommendation of the Iowa DNR. Another completed project in the park was installing two hard surfaced handicap parking stalls, next to the cook shack.

It is with a heavy heart the decision was made to cancel the 2020 Volunteer Appreciation banquet. Due to Covid-19 and the health and safety of the public and their well- being was of utmost concern. The cancellation of the banquet in no way diminishes the amount of good deeds and community services our great volunteers contribute every day! I just want to acknowledge and give a huge thank you to everyone who gives their time and resources to help make Carter Lake a great place to live!

Iowa Residential Utility Disruption Prevention <u>Program</u>

To provide assistance to eligible households with up to \$2,000 towards electric, natural gas and water bills if they are at risk of disconnection due to an inability to pay due to a COVID-19 related loss of income.

To be eligible:

1. A primary Iowa residence with active residential utility accounts, renters may apply as long as the utility account is in the applicant's name;

2. An unpaid utility bill balance or have previously entered into a payment plan with their utility provider;

3. An annual income that is 80% of the median family income, based on county and household size

4. Experienced a COVID-19 loss of income (job loss, reduction in hours, reduction in pay) on or after March 17, 2020 that resulted in hardship in paying bills for electric, natural gas, and/or water utility service provided between March 17th and October 31, 2020.

Applications will be accepted between October 8, 2020, and November 20, 2020, or until funding is depleted, whichever comes first. Assistance will be awarded based on application completeness and eligibility in order received until all funds have been exhausted.
